

CALL TO ORDER AND ESTABLISHMENT OF QUORUM

A Special Meeting of the Redmond City Council was called to order by Mayor Angela Birney at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was held in-person and remote. Councilmembers present and establishing a quorum were: Anderson, Carson, Fields, Forsythe, Khan, Kritzer and Stewart.

The purpose of the special meeting was to finalize changes to the 2023-2024 biennial budget.

Councilmember Fields, as the Presiding Officer of the Finance, Administration, and Communications Committee of the Whole, chaired the budget portion of the meeting.

Chip Corder, Finance Director, reviewed Council and staff changes to the preliminary budget and Council follow up items.

Discussion ensued regarding: funding; naming; sources of funds; tuition reimbursement process; Police Department electric vehicles; vehicle replacement cycle; Transportation Benefit District; sales tax increase; public safety levy next steps; setting aside funds for a recession;

(recessed 8:56 p.m., reconvened 9:08 p.m.)

Discussion continued: expenditure restrictions; banked property tax; one-time funding and ongoing funding; preferred uses for the Public Safety Reserve; a new public safety levy;

MOTION: Councilmember Kritzer moved to extend the meeting time by 10 minutes. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Stuart.

VOTE: The motion passed without objection. (7 - 0)

The study session scheduled for November 22, 2022, is canceled and the Council will take a vote on the budget on December 6, 2022.

There being no further business to come before the Council the special meeting adjourned at 10:04 p.m.
