Darrell Lowe, Police Chief, reported to the Members of the Council regarding:

- Policy manual is available on the City's website;
- Policy includes all Police technology;
- Data is not generally stored for more than 30 days or per state law or associated with a criminal case;
- Data access;
- Audit trail for searches that occur;
- Body-Worn Cameras;
- Digital evidence storage system;
- Officer accountability and transparency;
- Community traits and policy framework;
- Drone as a first responder;
- Situational awareness;
- Infrared camera;
- Collision avoidance;
- Infrastructure and command architecture;
- Every flight is associated with a case number or call for service;
- Dashboard and use cases;
- Policy, privacy and governance;
- Automatic license plate readers;
- Investigative uses;
- Parking enforcement;
- School zone speed enforcement; and
- ESSB 6002 - compliance requirements.
