1. Acceptance of King County WaterWorks Grant

Department: Public Works Action: Consent, July 19th

Jessica Atlakson, Environmental Scientist, reported to the Members of the Committee regarding:

- Tosh Creek Watershed;
- Increasing street sweeping;
- Analyze data of water quality;
- Summary report of the data;
- Highest priority for watershed restoration; and
- Emerging contaminant from vehicle tires.
