


CIP 2021-2022 Portfolio Progress



2021 Summary

Substantial Completion target: 16 of 19 projects met 97.5% of expected work completed

Project changes

Lift stations, delays in permitting, property and supply chain

Project Savings

- SR 520 Trail Grade Separation at NE 40th St: \$2,091,752 (15%)
- SE Redmond Water Tank Seismic Retrofit and Painting: \$667,727 (11%)*
- Smith Woods Pond and Stream Rehabilitation: \$454,452 (45%)*
- Redmond Way Rockery: \$290,284 (18%)

Total savings on all projects substantially completed in 2021 is approximately \$4 million



Industry Overview

Challenges

- Concrete strike
- Labor shortage top concern
- Material prices dropping, but still high
- Stockpiling of materials in yards and warehouses by contractors

Positive Trends

- 6% construction growth expected (Cummings)
- A resemblance to the pre-pandemic world.
 (Association of General Contractors of America)
- Factory output increasing
- Some manufacturing is coming back to the US
- Commodity prices have started to fall but are still above pre-pandemic levels



2022 Look Ahead

Currently targeting 31 projects for substantial completion
