A. AM No. 24-015: Approval of Proposed Land Transfer to Plymouth Housing Development

Carol Helland, Director of Planning and Community Development, introduced this item. Representatives from Plymouth Housing and ARCH were in attendance, spoke to the project, and responded to Councilmember inquiries.

MOTION:

Councilmember Kritzer moved to authorize the Mayor to pursue and execute a transfer of the city-owned property at 16725 Cleveland Street to Plymouth Housing with restrictions to include, but not limited to, limiting the use of the property in perpetuity to permanent supportive housing and, if the property is ever not substantially used for such purpose, the ownership will automatically revert back to the City of Redmond. Further, the Mayor is authorized to include additional restrictions and milestones that will ensure that the project, substantially as proposed, will be built and opened in a timely manner. The Mayor is further authorized to take such additional actions necessary to effectuate this transfer and to make necessary future amendments consistent with the objectives outlined in this motion. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Stuart.

VOTE:

The motion passed (5-1), with Councilmembers Forsythe, Kritzer, Nuevacamina, Salahuddin, and Stuart in support and Councilmember Anderson in opposition.
