## Community Stability Funds - Process

In early September, the City of Kirkland issued a Rapid Response Fund Request for Proposals (RFP) with \$167,000 in available funds for organizations impacted by federal administration immigration policies. In anticipation of having potential funds, Redmond requested the inclusion of this language in the RFP materials: "The City of Kirkland values subregional partnerships and will share RFP proposals received with the City of Redmond. The City of Redmond may have additional funds available at a later date and will consider awards for applications at the City of Redmond's sole discretion."

Upon approval of Council's allocation of funding for Community Stability, Redmond emailed all currently funded agencies notifying them of Council's allocation and encouraged them to apply using the same RFP. The following is a summary of the process staff used for developing funding recommendations.

- 1. 24 applications were received through the Rapid Response Fund RFP, totaling over \$1.2M.
- Redmond human services staff reviewed all proposals and identified 14 proposals that most aligned Council's criteria.
- 3. Staff also met with Eastside for All Executive Director, Debbie Lacy, to better understand and consider 'on-the-ground' issues.
- Staff recruited two commissioners to review and develop funding recommendations.
- 5. When developing their recommendations, staff and commissioners considered how the proposals were meeting specific and unique needs facing immigrant communities, funding gaps that remained after Kirkland's awards, and the type of services being offered (e.g. legal assistance, food, etc).
