

Grant and Sales Tax Eligibility Requirements – Compliance Summary

City of Redmond Police Department

As of May 23, 2025

This document outlines the Redmond Police Department's current compliance status with state-level eligibility requirements related to grant funding and public safety sales tax distributions. It addresses statutory mandates found in various RCWs (Revised Code of Washington), associated department policies, and training initiatives.

1. Immigration & Protected Class Enforcement Prohibition

RCWs: 43.17.425, 10.93.160

These laws prohibit investigating, detaining, or taking law enforcement actions based solely on an individual's religion, immigration or citizenship status, or other protected characteristics.

- **Redmond Police Department Policy 413 – Immigration Violations**
Complies with state law and affirms RPD's non-involvement in immigration enforcement.
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2. Violence De-Escalation and First Aid Training

RCWs: 43.101.455, 36.28A.445

These statutes mandate that law enforcement agencies provide violence de-escalation and first aid training, including the development of department-specific guidelines.

- **Training Compliance Status:**
De-escalation and first aid training is delivered via:
 - A 24-hour Patrol Tactics in-service training
 - Online training through the Criminal Justice Training Commission (CJTC)

As of July 2025, approximately 50% of RPD officers have completed the required Patrol Tactics curriculum. All remaining officers (who graduated prior to January 1, 2024) are on track to meet the state's deadline of January 1, 2028.

3. Use of Force & De-Escalation Policies

RCW: 10.120.020

Agencies must adopt de-escalation and use of force policies consistent with the model policy issued by the Attorney General and submit them accordingly.

- **RPD Policy 300 – Use of Force**
 - Policy 300.3.1 addresses alternative tactics and de-escalation techniques.
 - All policies are in line with the Attorney General’s model and have been submitted.
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4. Use of Force Reporting & Accountability

RCWs: 10.118, 10.120

Agencies must collect and report all qualifying use of force incidents to the state.

- **Policy Framework:**
 - **Policy 300.4.2** references the state’s use of force data collection system, including reporting requirements for pointing a firearm.
 - **Policy 300.5** details mandatory reporting requirements following a use of force incident.
 - **Policy 301 – Incident Review Board** outlines the post-incident review process for force incidents, pursuits, and collisions. The board meets monthly and includes representation from training, use-of-force instructors, and peers.

The board’s goal is accountability and ongoing improvement through training, supervision, and policy updates.

5. Civil Protection Orders & Firearms Regulations

RCWs: 7.105, 9.41

RCW 7.105 governs a wide range of civil protection orders. RCW 9.41 covers firearm regulations, including ownership restrictions and enforcement.

- **Policy Coverage:**

- **Policy 339 – Extreme Risk Protection Orders:** Implements procedures consistent with RCW 7.105, including firearm surrender provisions (Policy 339.4.3).
 - **Policy 310 – Domestic Violence Court Orders:** Complies with RCW 7.105.010.
 - **Policy 207 – Concealed Pistol License:** Covers CPL issuance and restrictions.
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6. Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) Training

Requirement: 25% of officers must complete 40-hour CIT training.

- **Compliance Status:**
 - As of July 15, 2025, 21 of 79 sworn officers (26.6%) have completed the 40-hour CIT course.
 - Two additional officers are scheduled to complete it by August 2025.
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7. Gender-Based Violence & Trauma-Informed Interviewing

RCWs: 43.101.272, 43.101.276

These laws require specialized training for officers involved in investigating gender-based violence, including sexual assault cases.

- **Compliance Status:**
 - RPD has two detectives assigned to sexual assault and gender-based violence investigations. Both have completed the required training per RCW 43.101.272.
 - RCW 43.101.276, passed in 2025, requires statewide compliance beginning July 1, 2026. RPD will ensure all required staff are trained by this deadline.
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Summary & Next Steps

Redmond Police Department remains in active compliance with nearly all current statutory eligibility requirements for grant and sales tax funding. Several key training efforts are

ongoing and on track to meet state deadlines. Continued tracking, policy updates, and documentation will ensure sustained compliance and future eligibility.
