The City is working with current recreation contractors to offer:

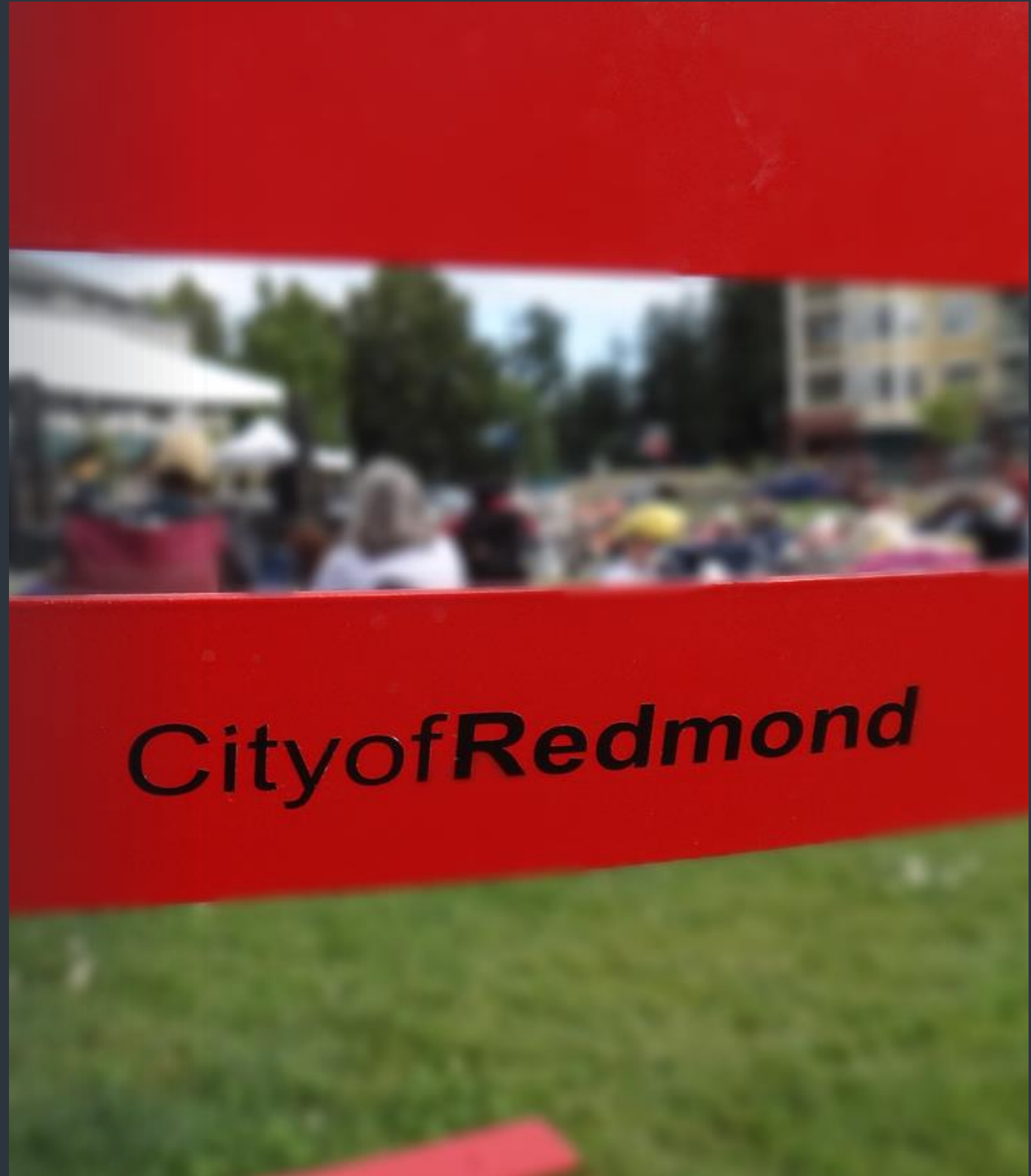
- Fitness in the Park
