OUTCOMES:

Per the conversation with Council at the February Public Safety and Human Services Committee of the Whole, staff has engaged a Public Safety Sounding Board to provide input, feedback, ideas, and recommendations relevant to the ongoing development of a Public Safety Funding Plan that may lead to a ballot measure in November. As a part of the discussions, the Police and Fire Departments, based on their strategic plans, have identified opportunities to keep pace with growth and enhance safety in Redmond.

Discussions with the Council, Community and the Public Safety Sounding Board will be ongoing for much of the year leading up to the November election (please see the milestones in Attachment B).
