Time Constraints:

The existing Micromobility Permit is in a pilot status. By transitioning from a pilot program to a permanent program, the City of Redmond can receive revenue from the City's chosen vendor. In its current pilot program state, the City is not able to collect fees from its micromobility vendor.

ANTICIPATED RESULT IF NOT APPROVED:

If the pilot program is not approved, the vendor will be required to remove all scooters within a period of time. This would impact residents and visitor's ability to move around Redmond and challenge commuters who have become accustomed to this service.
