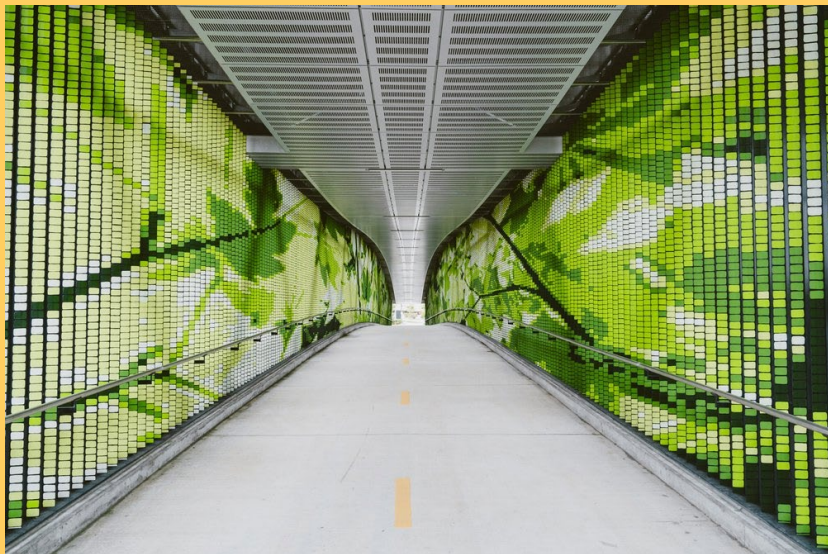

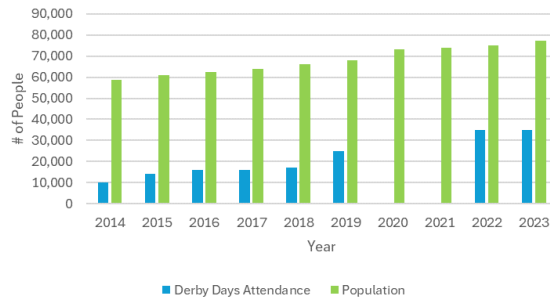

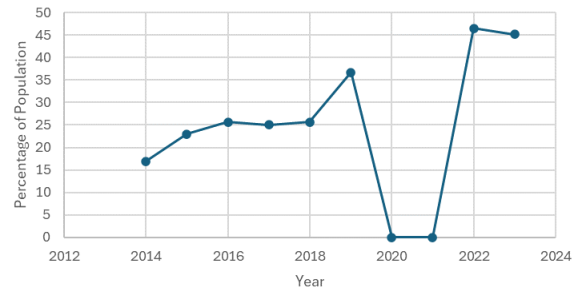

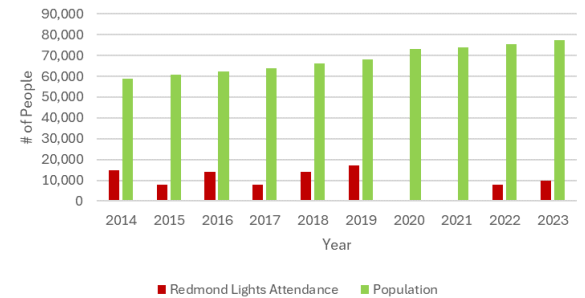
Derby Days Attendance vs. Time



Percentage of Population Attending Derby Days

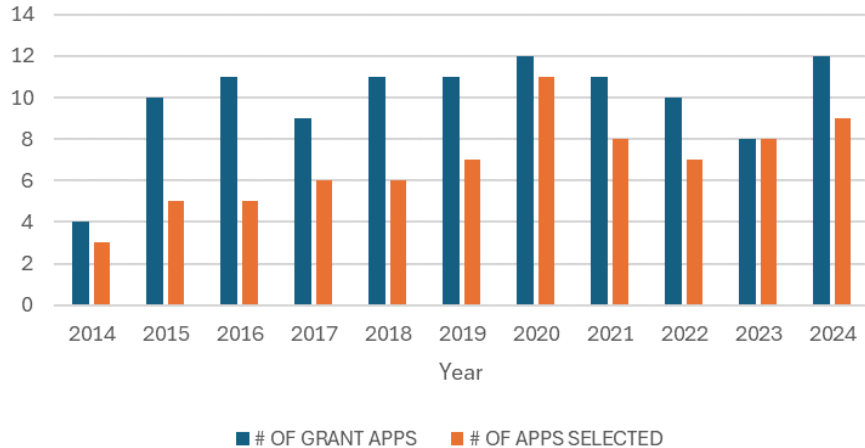


Redmond Lights Attendance vs. Time

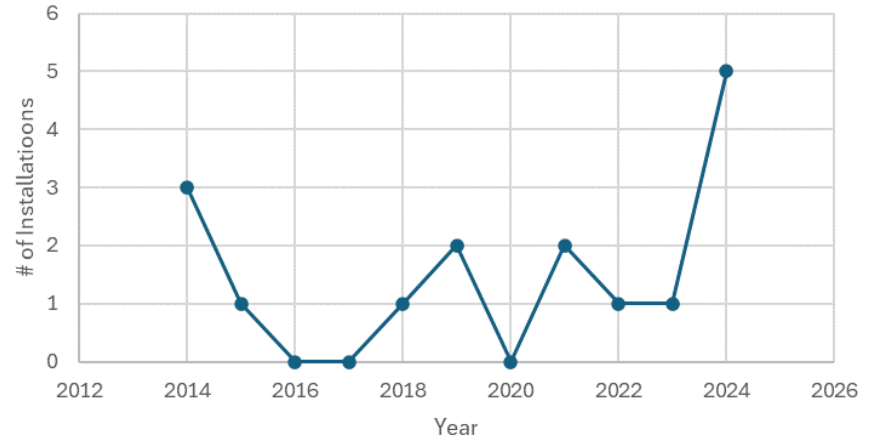

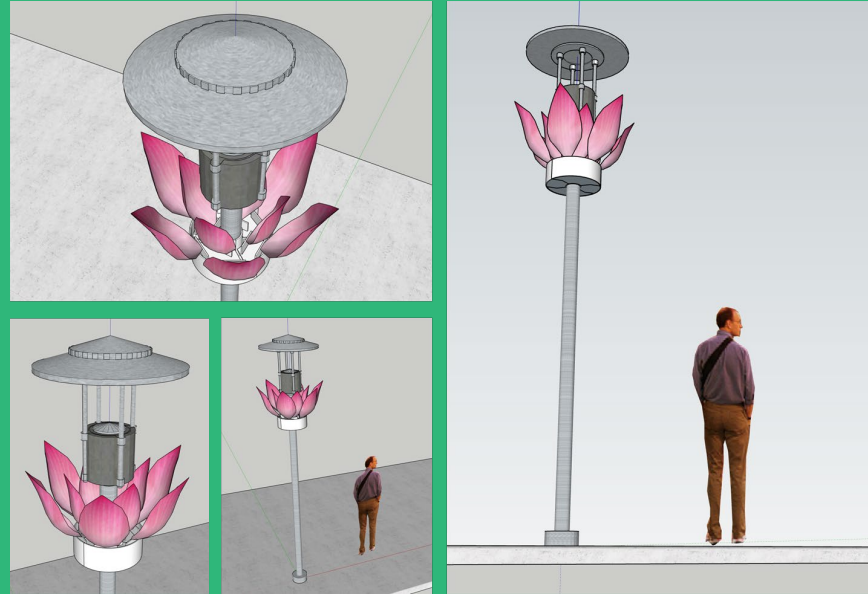
