Approval of a Resolution Updating the Bike and Scooter Share Permit Fees

a. Resolution No. 1596: A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Redmond, Washington, Adding New User Fees and Costs to the City Public Works Department Schedule of Fees Charges and Penalties Associated with Planning Department Bicycle and Scooter Sharing Authorized Under Chapter 12.08 of the Redmond Municipal Code Amending the User Fees Schedule for Public Works, Effective January 1, 2025

OVERVIEW STATEMENT:

After launching in the summer of 2019, the micromobility pilot program (also known as the bike and scooter-share program) has been a successful first-last mile mobility option for City of Redmond community members from 2019 through 2024. In 2023, City staff received direction from the City Council to transition from a pilot to a permanent program with enhanced requirements. In 2024, City staff took that feedback and completed a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) process and identified the vendor to manage the permanent program. The permanent program is set to begin on January 1, 2025. As part of the permanent program contract, staff have identified additional fees to be added to the Bike and Scooter Share Permit Fees Schedule. We are seeking approval of a Resolution to incorporate the additional per-trip and per-vehicle fees that will offset staff time for program management.

The Micromobility Permit is transitioning from a pilot to a permanent program. By transitioning from a pilot program to a permanent program, the City of Redmond can receive revenue from the City's chosen vendor. In its current pilot program state, the City is not able to collect fees from its micromobility vendor. The program is anticipated to begin January 1, 2025.

ANTICIPATED RESULT IF NOT APPROVED:

If the additional per-trip and per-vehicle fees are not approved, the program will not be able to collect ongoing revenue from the vendor to offset staff time costs.
