Phase 1: Data Gathering & Community Input **Phase 2:** Building the Plan with continued Community Input

Phase 3: Plan Adoption

Spring/Summer 2022

Gather community feedback through a community-wide survey and hold stakeholder discussions, tabling events, and a virtual public meeting.

> WE ARE HERE -Gathering community input and assessing the system

Summer/Fall 2022

Create the draft PARCC Plan update, which will be shared with the community through a second virtual public meeting.

Winter 2022/2023

Incorporate community feedback into the final draft of the PARCC Plan update and present to City Council for approval.

Survey Highlights

- Designed in coordination with staff
- Late March to mid May 2022
- Mailed to 2,500 randomized addresses, with two follow-up mailers
- 330 respondents (13% response rate, 5% Margin of Error)
- Survey available to entire community in Chinese, English, Russian, and Spanish



"My prime reason to choose Redmond suburb was its parks and trails. My family visits them more than twice per day."






Survey Highlights Barriers for Recreation Programs


