**Buildings:** Aging, seismically vulnerable, not growth-ready

**People:** Facilities don't meet modern health, safety, or inclusion standards

**Equipment:** Needs modernization to address wildfires, EV fires, and vertical rescue

Why this plan: Lays out a path to modernize and sustain our fire system

Long-range capital plan for fire facilities, fleet, and equipment

# Why now:

- Growth & evolving risks
- Impact fees outdated & unusable
- Aligning with Redmond 2050 & citywide capital planning

## Goal:

Enable impact fee use & ensure scalable, resilient fire services

- 2022-2027 Community Risk Assessment & Standards of Cover
- 2022-2027 Strategic Plan

# Developed through:

- Facility condition assessments
- Operational performance analysis
- Community and interdepartmental input



# Capital Investment Strategy

# Phased roadmap through 2050

- Station 11: Remodel, rebuild, potential relocation
- Station 12: Relocation into city limits
- Station 16: Lifecycle renovation
- Station 17: Interior buildout
- New Station 19: Future growth coverage

Support facilities: Logistics warehouse, training, admin relief

**Apparatus:** Ladder truck, new engines, specialty equipment





## **Estimated investment:**

- \$83M through 2050
- \$70M in long-term projects beyond 2050

# **Funding tools:**

• Impact fees, General Fund, grants, levies, bonds, partnerships

# New eligibility:

• First fire capital plan aligned with GMA for impact fee use



# **Level of Service & Readiness**

# LOS pressures from:

• Vertical growth, concurrency, aging infrastructure

## Plan addresses:

- Station siting, staffing capacity, apparatus readiness
- Seismic upgrades, energy compliance, and ADA accessibility



# Equity, Sustainability & Resilience

- Equity:
  - Inclusive facility design, verifying service access in underserved areas
- Sustainability:
  - EV apparatus, LEED-ready facilities, solar readiness
- Resilience:
  - Backup power, wildfire readiness, community preparedness



# **Community Outreach**

- Community input gathered through:
  - Strategic planning surveys
  - Stakeholder sessions
- **Planning Commission** reviewed the plan as part of the 2025-26 Annual Docket:
  - Public Hearing
  - Provided feedback on accountability, funding stability, growth planning, and sustainability
  - Staff responses documented in the Planning Commission Recommendations Report
