HOMELESSNESS RESPONSE

Helping housed and housing insecure community members on a path toward stability.

- 288 INDIVIDUALS SERVED
- 210 INITIAL STABILIZATION GOALS COMPLETED AND/OR CASES RESOLVED
- 68% OF HOMELESS CLIENTS HOUSED
- 1,311 HOURS OF DIRECT SERVICE

HUMAN SERVICES PROGRAM

Funding support to local nonprofit organizations so that residents can access needed resources, such as counseling, food, job support, and more.

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Making a difference

For the last four years the Co-Response Unit has worked diligently with an aging Redmond resident. The resident struggles with a significant mental health issue resulting in an involuntary inpatient treatment. The condition of the home became unlivable. The Co-Response Unit and MHP worked with social services, attorneys, the Designated Crisis Responders, Mobile Integrated Health & Involuntary Treatment Act (ITA) Court to secure formal guardianship, a new supportive living location, and the rehabilitation of the home.
