Dear City Council Members and Mayor Birney,

I'd like to start with a quote...

"To achieve this vision, I will lead the city council and staff to work with the community as well as different resources and agencies, to fully understand and address each goal and issue..."

Sound familiar? That's your statement Mayor Birney while you were running for mayor.

Leadership? Work with staff and agencies? Where is your leadership Mayor? You knew we were bargaining in good faith for accommodations, you knew we were submitting religious exemptions and the city sent us approvals which we signed on city created docu-signs. Then you came in with a blaze of glory and tore them up. Where is the mayoral candidate who came to the station asking us for our support in her race? We backed you, we supported you and you've betrayed us. We have lost complete trust in your ability to do your job with this city's best interest at heart.

I am angry. The tactics being used are bullying and coercion at the highest level. This means that the person involved should have legal capacity to give consent; should be so situated as to be able to exercise <u>free power of choice</u>, without the intervention of any element of force, fraud, deceit, duress, overreaching, or other ulterior form of constraint <u>or coercion</u>; and should have sufficient knowledge and comprehension of the elements of the subject matter involved as to enable him to make an understanding and enlightened decision.

I started with a quote from the mayor's campaign and I'll end with a quote. One that's been used as far back as 1779.

"I was only following orders."

'I was only following orders' has been used <u>unsuccessfully</u> as a legal defense in hundreds of cases, probably most notably at the Nuremberg tribunals following World War II.

Mayor Birney, please stop this nonsense and do the right thing. Stand by the firefighters who have worked to keep this city safe for the entire pandemic, zero transmission to or from patients. Allow us to keep our jobs so we can keep serving and protecting the citizens of Redmond.
