Forsythe	1. Appreciating the complexity of a contract like this, I would like to see each subcontractor listed as to their part in this project (some are listed as their scope, some are not.)	The subconsultants' scope assignments for each discipline in the Reid Middleton Agreement are updated. Please see updated agreement attachment.
Kritzer	2. How much has been spent to date on this project?	<p>The total current project costs for Fire Station 16 and the adjacent Maintenance Facility is \$169,829. This includes Reid Middleton completed preliminary engineering costs at \$119,329 plus City staff costs approximated \$50,500.</p> <p>Please keep in mind the project cost cited in the Council memorandum fiscal sections are broke down by project <u>phase</u> costs (Design Phase, Construction Phase). The consultant agreement costs are included in the Design Phase costs.</p>
Kritzer	3. Was the original approval of the funding for this project done through the biennial budget process?	<p>The bulk of the funding for the Fire Station 16 and the adjacent Maintenance Facility Seismic Upgrade were approved with the Capital Improvement program as part of the 2019-2020 biennial budget. No, presently the Chief/HR are in the process of reallocating funds from a (recently retired) existing FTE, to fund the existing MHP position as part of the GF and will utilize the grants funds for a 2nd MHP. This will meet the community's needs.

RPD does not currently use facial recognition technology, and presently our overall UAS using has been minimal and primarily for crime scene documentation, and overall situational assessments, (traffic conditions, crowd size, etc.)

Is there an FAQ that residents can access on this program going forward, especially in regards to use of images and privacy?	Presently no FAQ exists. RPD staff will work with City communications on this moving forward.

(I see it noted that this was shared with council previously, but would like to review it since I was not on council when it was presented.)
