Staff are not seeking action at this time. This item provides important background context for the Council to consider and approve contracts for the required Environmental Impact Statement and the visioning consultant services that will support completion of the update work consistent with state law.
		Early phases of outreach will not likely be impacted by restrictions associated with the pandemic – later phases planned for the fall could be impacted and staff is continuously monitoring this situation and will propose adaptive measures if necessary.
		Staff will be presenting the Community Involvement Plan at an upcoming meeting scheduled for May 19, 2020. First components include launching a project page and identifying a Community Advisory Committee- this will occur May -June timeframe.
		Next phases of engagement will include visioning and land use scenario development. These phases will not begin until July or August and will likely involve stakeholder scans as a first step. These early phases will not be significantly impacted by current pandemic restrictions but later project elements, that are planned for the fall, may be impacted if the public health restrictions are still in place. Staff has required prospective firms to identify creative and new ways to involve the public in community
		meetings and charettes as part of their proposals.
