IV. <u>DESCRIPTION/BACKGROUND</u>

Parks and Recreation staff have been collaborating on the Downtown Park Grand Opening. The goals of the event include:

- Celebrating the City of Redmond's first urban park
- Providing an opportunity for reengagement of Downtown with this being the last major construction project,
- Presenting a placemaking project introducing the public to this urban park and all its possibilities through performing arts, visual and digital art, recreation and community gathering

ROAD CLOSURES & PARKING

8:00am – 10:00pm: 161st Street Road Closure (between Cleveland Street and

Redmond Way

5:00pm – 10:00pm: Cleveland Street Road Closure between Redmond Way and

Leary Way (local access eastbound only)

After discussions with Police, Staff determined closing down Cleveland Street would be the safest option for this event considering we may have attendance of close to 5,000. This will also be the first large-scale event in Downtown Park and we have no comparisons at this point.

Traffic Operations approved the traffic plan and detour route and signage

Parking is secured at Redmond Town Center, Sky Painting Parking Lot, Municipal Campus and on-street.

Communications will be sent to neighboring residents and business owners and the broader community about traffic detours and parking.

EVENT TIMELINE

1:00pm – 4:00pm: OneRedmond Scavenger Hunt

OneRedmond will be providing a unique digital scavenger hunt to encourage activation of Downtown businesses. The "Dragon Run Digital Scavenger Hunt" produced in partnership with DigiPen and Bit Toys runs from 1:00-4:00 pm. The registration tent is located on the Cleveland Street side of the park in front of Hoffman's.

5:00pm – 5:30pm: Ribbon Cutting

Honored guests will celebrate the evolution of Downtown Redmond with the completion of Downtown Park, the City's beautiful urban park. The Ribbon Cutting Ceremony begins at 5:00 pm. at the Pavilion. There will be a tent with water and poster boards of the park

5:30pm – 6:30pm: Community Picnic

Staff has been coordinating with OneRedmond and Downtown restaurants in order to provide a pre-order option to activate Downtown. Messaging around the picnic:

6:30pm – 8:10pm: Performance – A Hundred Years from Today by Lucia Neare's Theatrical Wonders

A Hundred Years from Today is a site-specific, interactive performance in which we will treat the different areas of Downtown Park as six distinct "rooms." These will be activated with a variety of performances, mini-installations, and participatory offerings. Audiences are free to wander the site – and experience the performance – following their own timing, whim, and curiosities.
