LEGISLATIVE CONTEXT

Initiative 1639 was a Washington state ballot initiative concerning firearms regulation that was passed into law on November 6, 2018

Law goes into effect - July 1, 2019



PURPOSE

Understand operational impacts to department from legislative changes to firearms laws

- Possession
- Background checks



I-1639 GOING INTO EFFECT

- Restrictions on firearm purchase and ownership
- Raises minimum age to purchase a gun to
 21
- Adds background checks, increases waiting periods, and enacts firearm storage requirements



BACKGROUND CHECK CHANGES

Enhanced background checks for sales/transfers of semiautomatic assault rifles (SARS)

Within 10 days, Chief of Police **must** provide written notice to the dealer whether the purchaser is eligible to possess a semiautomatic assault rifle and whether the application to purchase is approved.

We anticipate a high volume of high-liability and time intensive checks

If a check is longer than 10 days the firearm licensor may release to the purchaser.
