IV. DESCRIPTION/BACKGROUND

Ballot initiative 1639 was passed into law on November 6, 2018 and goes into effect on July 1, 2019. Specific to this law is a shift in the workload for the police department regarding enhanced background checks for sales/transfers of semiautomatic assault rifles (SARS). The department is required within a timeline of ten business days to provide written notice to the firearms dealer whether the purchaser is eligible to possess a semiautomatic assault rifle and whether the application to purchase is approved. This additional workload may impact the timeliness of other work in the records unit

This executive briefing is designed to familiarize council with the operational impacts of this law and answer questions about the workload.
