- WHEREAS, technology has a vital role in our daily lives and the future of society, as many critical infrastructure sectors are increasingly reliant on information systems to support financial services, energy, telecommunications, transportation, utilities, and emergency response systems; and
- WHEREAS, internet users, residents, and the information infrastructure face an increasing threat of malicious cyber-attack and significant financial and personal privacy losses due to identity theft and fraud; and
- WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security has established the Office of Cybersecurity and Communications and devoted resources solely to support the strengthening and securing of the country's cyber infrastructure at the state, local, tribal, and territorial levels; and
- WHEREAS, maintaining the security of cyberspace is a shared responsibility in which everyone has a critical role, and awareness of computer security essentials will improve the security of the City of Redmond information infrastructure and economy; and
