Letter of Interest

As a growing community, Overlake Village will be attracting newer residents from diverse background, bringing with them different cultural histories and memories. Both new and old residents will need to feel belonged and be able to contribute to it in order to create a sustainable and vibrant community. Public art has a role to activate the complex and dynamic relationship between individuals and community and to help residents to connect and explore a shared future.

The core of my art practice is based on my experience as an Asian American and as an immigrant. I am fascinated by our ability to invest meanings into ordinary objects. A common thread in my projects is the use of unexpected but simple material and imagery to create meaning and metaphor that connect individuals with community and place.

My previous experience working as part of a design team: As part of the creative team that designed Gateway Discovery Park in Portland, Oregon, I worked with PLACE Studios on the overall theme of the park, community engagement, as well as designing the public art sculpture at the entrance of the Park. For the Tacoma Lincoln District Revitalization Project, I worked with KPR Landscape Architects to create permanent public artworks that serve as gateways to the business district. I also contributed to the aesthetic design of the streetscape, identified opportunities for integrated artworks to be incorporated into the streetscape design and as well as creating opportunities for local artist participations. The project is further informed by an active engagement processes that reflects the needs of the diverse community, and projects a community identity and communicate an authentic sense of place. The resulting gateway artwork highlights the presence of the diverse communities—the 16,000 metal sequins create the shimmering effect that symbolizes the dynamic participation of the communities surrounding the business district.
