IV. <u>DESCRIPTION/BACKGROUND</u>

Since 2012, the Redmond Arts Season is a grant program that supports quality arts and cultural programs that are accessible to Redmond residents and visitors throughout the year in order to:

- <u>Provide inclusivity</u>: Create connections and partnerships across Redmond's diverse community
- <u>Cultivate a creative environment</u>: Provide an encouraging environment for artists and participants at all levels
- <u>Produce a thriving arts scene in Redmond</u>: Support local artists and arts and cultural organizations

The City of Redmond provides support and resources to help connect Redmond's diverse community and develop our creative community. This includes any one or a combination of the following resources to meet these goals:

- Project support grants of \$1,500, \$2,500 and \$3,500
- City of Redmond venue(s), dependent on availability
- Coordinated communications, marketing, and outreach activities by City of Redmond staff

The overall budget for this program is \$28,000.

A. Analysis

The 2020 Art Season Grant Call was created with purposeful intent to simplify the process and more clearly define the criteria in hopes of attracting new diverse applicants into the process, and better integrating this program to reflect the goals of the Cultural Inclusion Resolution (No. 1465).

The 2020 Art Season Call opened on October 11, 2019, with a deadline of December 06, 2019. A Grant Workshop was held at Centro Cultural Mexicano on November 12, 2019 and six groups participated. A total of 19 applications were submitted, a 65% increase from the previous year. There were eleven new applicants, and seven applications from previous grant winners. Exhibit A summarizes the proposals.

The 2020 panel met on Tuesday, December 10, 2019 at 10:00 AM at Redmond City Hall. The panel consisted of:

Cheri Fowler, Redmond Arts & Culture Commissioner Kari Tai, Redmond Arts & Culture Commissioner Chris Weber, City of Redmond Cultural Arts Administrator Lorna Velasco, City of Redmond Cultural Arts Coordinator The following selection criteria were used to rate the applications:

- <u>Public Benefit</u>: Project describes meaningful efforts to create community participation and reach diverse and underserved audience. The project aligns with the City of Redmond's Resolution No. 1465, affirming a commitment towards a culturally inclusive community.
- Quality Project: Provides a clear, well-conceived, compelling project where art is the primary component and promotes arts participation and community relations.
 Various art forms include dance, music, film, theatre, visual arts, literary arts, and festivals.
- <u>Feasibility & Quality of Past Work</u>: They have a proven track record of
 presenting in their field and/or other programs and/or demonstrated ability to
 produce the program (or similar program) in and around the City of Redmond.
 There is evidence of community involvement and support. The budget is clear and
 realistic.
- Match: Applicant has matching funds in the forms of: in-kind donations, volunteer hours, outside organization support such as grants, corporate, and/or individual donations.

The panel unanimously recommended that the Arts & Culture Commission fund the following groups the amounts listed in Exhibit B. On December 12, 2019, the Arts & Culture Commission approved these recommendations.
