



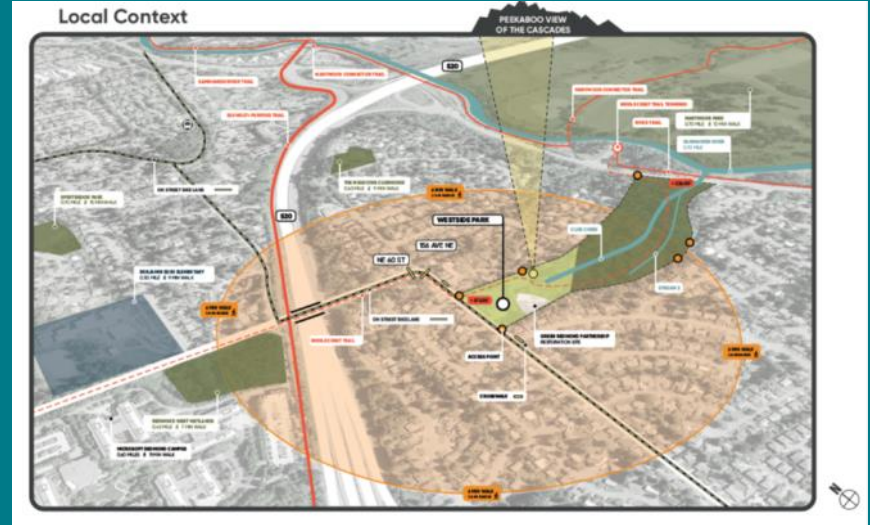

Project Overview

Westside Park is a 40-year-old neighborhood park in the Chamblis neighborhood. Existing recreation features include a small playground, open ball field, net basketball court, and open space. Renovation to existing features in the park will be to repair damage and updated play equipment. The bridge over trail to connect through Westside park and through it connect to the existing over the park trail.


The park was constructed in the City 1960s, developed in the 1970s and is currently 40 years old. A master planning process was undertaken in 2009 to update the park and include a formal plan for the park in the neighborhood. The master plan indicated some improvements to the 18th St. Trail, including a new ball field trail through the park and a new trail. The park is a neighborhood destination for recreation and an important connection to Redmond Park, Chamblis and the park.

The overall project budget is \$1.4 million.

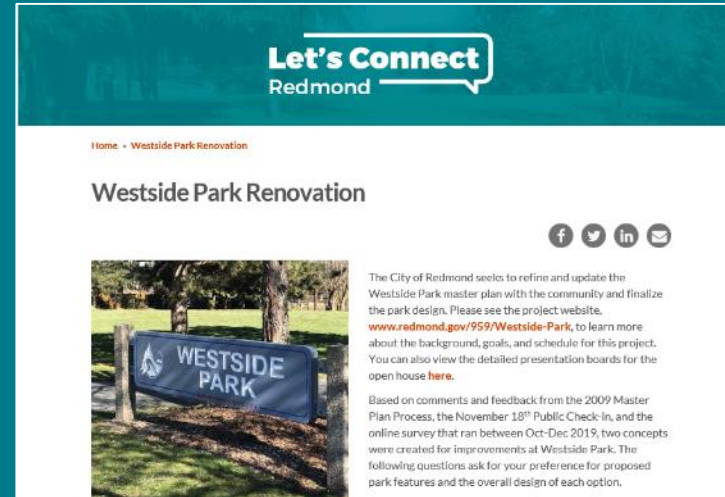

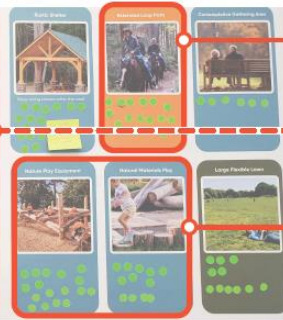
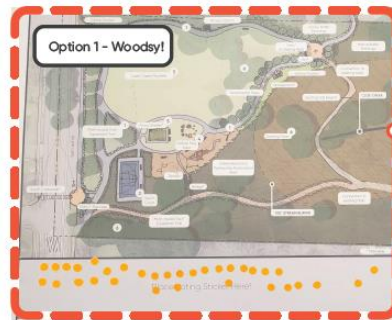

Dot Voting Results

Key Takeaways (includes Survey)



Extended Loop Path = 84 Votes (87%)

Woodsy! Option = 83 Votes (67%)

Nature Play = 58 (45%)

- One large field provides sightlines across park, team sports, and multiple activities plus room for trees, loop path & drainage
- Keep backstop for meeting spot & practice
- Play features should differentiate Westside from other city parks
- Preference for a crosswalk on the north end



Sustainable Shelter = 73 Votes (60%)

Multisport Court = 82 Votes (77%)

Multiple Playfields = 65 Votes (86%)*
