- WHEREAS, property crime is the most prevalent type of crime locally and nationally, and the most likely type of crime for people to experience at home; and
- WHEREAS, 2020 finds many of us spending more of our time at home; and
- WHEREAS, property crime continues to be a focus for the Redmond Police Department; and
- WHEREAS, criminals often look for easy targets when selecting homes, so making simple steps to improve home safety is critical to deterring property crime; and
- WHEREAS, over fifty percent of the crimes Redmond Police investigate involve theft or burglary; and
- WHEREAS, nationally, the average loss from a home burglary is over \$2,200; and
- WHEREAS, thirty percent of burglaries in the United States involve entry through an unlocked door or window; and
- WHEREAS, taking time to discuss home safety with everyone in the house is crucially important to preventing crime; and
- WHEREAS, homes are valuable cornerstones for families and deserve to be protected;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, ANGELA BIRNEY, Mayor of the City of Redmond, do hereby proclaim October 5-9, 2020, as a
