City acceptance of the easement from Microsoft means that construction of the pedestrian and bicycle connection can be completed in 2021.

ANTICIPATED RESULT IF NOT APPROVED:

If the easement is not accepted by the City, public access to light rail service from the west side of SR 520 would be over a circuitous route: south along 148th Avenue NE to the 148th/SR 520 interchange area, then onto the SR 520 pedestrian -bicycle trail along the west side of SR 520, then to the Overlake Village Bridge and the Overlake Village light rail station.
