Councilmember Myers spoke in opposition to the expense for vinyl truck wrapping.

VOTE: The motion passed with Councilmember Fields and Myers in opposition. (5-2).

STAFF REPORTS

a. AM No. 18-145: Workforce Management System Implementation

Ms. Malisa Files, Finance Director, and Ms. Mellody Matthes, Human Resources Director, provided a report to the Mayor and Members of Council regarding Workforce Management the System implementation project. Discussion included: Investment; the condition of the systems sought for replacement; duplication of staff efforts and shadow systems implemented as workarounds; scope, schedule, and cost of the project, and next steps. City staff will bring the item forward to the Council for their consideration at the October 2, 2018, regular business meeting.

OMBUDSPERSON REPORT

Councilmember Padhye reported receiving citizen contacts regarding:

- an encampment that has developed in the City;
- a request to update the City's project viewer;
- community center user fees;
- Sammamish River Trail maintenance;
- Traffic infrastructure, the Downtown Park, and water pooling near residential property; and
- two proposals submitted to the City regarding possible accessibility bills.

Councilmember Margeson reported receiving citizen contacts regarding:

- playground equipment and access to Westside Park; and
- Redmond police officer participation in the recent Susan G. Koman breast cancer walk.

Councilmember Birney reported receiving citizen contacts regarding the opening of the Downtown Park. She thanked everyone who worked on the project.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Mayor's Day of Concern Food Drive

Councilmember Myers spoke regarding the upcoming food drive arrangements.

Planning and Public Works Committee of the Whole

Councilmember Padhye overviewed the items discussed during the September 11, 2018, committee meeting.

Puget Sound Regional Council Growth Management Policy Board

Councilmember Margeson spoke regarding the meeting held on September 6, 2018, noting that Growth Management Strategies were discussed.

Sound Cities Association - Public Issues Committee

Councilmember Margeson overviewed items discussed during the September 12, 2018, meeting. Pre-workshop items of discussion included open public meetings training. Additional items discussed included: King County's budget; the proposed Sound 2018-131

Cities Association legislative agenda; homelessness and the need to coordinate regional efforts; and the county's solid waste master plan and proposed fees. Councilmember Margeson concluded by noticing the December 5, 2018, annual meeting, location still to be determined.

Public Safety Committee of the Whole

Councilmember Fields reported regarding items discussed during the September 18, 2018, meeting.

Sound Cities Association - Regional Policy Committee

Councilmember Birney reported that the committee discussed the county's senior and human services levy, as well as the solid waste comprehensive plan.

Eastside Transportation Partnership

Councilmember Birney reported items discussed at the last meeting to include: statewide e-bike policy and trends; taking a comprehensive approach to building a road map to Washington's future; environmental issues and the Growth Management Act; and additional workshops to be held with respect to what is working, and not working, with the Growth Management Act.

King County Emergency Management Services Levy

Mayor Marchione reported that this levy is recommended for the August 2019 ballot. A resolution will be coming forward to the Council in January with respect to consideration.

NEW BUSINESS

At the request of a speaker from Items from the Audience, Councilmember Padhye inquired if the Council wanted to schedule a public hearing regarding Initiative I-1631.

MOTION: Councilmember Padhye moved to set a public hearing on the endorsement or not, of I-1631. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Birney.

Members of the Council discussed the motion and whether or not it is appropriate for the Council to take a position in this regard.

VOTE: The motion passed with Councilmembers Anderson and Carson in opposition. (5 - 2). [Clerk's
