Mayor Marchione read Resolution No. 1513 into the record and opened the public hearing.

The following people testified, as representatives of Microsoft, questioning the legal necessity of requiring this legislative process, and requesting that this is accomplished administratively instead: Mr. Donald Marcy and Mr. Jim Stanton.

There being no others wishing to testify, the public hearing closed and discussion moved to the Council.

Ms. Malisa Files, Finance Director, advised there is no dollar amount to this transaction; the action will remove the value of the utilities from the books; and the conversion of the public utilities to private utilities.

Mr. Jim Haney, City Attorney, stated that he provided a written opinion in this matter and it is included in as an attachment to the agenda memo; these are assets of the utility rate payers; and this needs to follow the legislative process.

MOTION: Councilmember Birney moved to adopt Resolution No. 1513. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Anderson.

Discussion ensued regarding the necessity of this legislative process; installing new utilities; value of the utility assets; and depreciation.

MOTION: Councilmember Myers moved to postpone Resolution No. 1513 to a time certain of two weeks from today (the next regular business

meeting). The motion was seconded by Councilmember Fields.

Discussion ensued regarding the impact of a two-week delay, and if there is expected to be any changes in state law in the next two weeks.
