King County Solid Waste Comprehensive Management Plan Review

Mr. Andy Rheaume, Utility Supervisor, Mr. Gary Schimek, Engineering Manager, and Mr. Pat Mclaughlin, KC Solid Waste Director, provided a presentation:

- discussion will be around recycling goals, transfer stations, and garbage disposal;
- the Council needs to consider adopting the plan by September 10, 2019;
- time critical policy decisions;
- regional system for most of King County;
- public/private partnerships;
- goal is to reach 70 percent recycling;
- modernizing transfer stations;
- further developing the Cedar Hills landfill;
- community concerns regarding noise, safety, odor and animals;
- regular environmental monitoring is conducted;
- identifying post Cedar Hills disposal method; and
- this item is recommended to go forward for approval at the July 2, 2019 regular business meeting.

General discussion ensued regarding improving the ability to recycle; educating businesses; lack of recycling in multi-family housing; code updates; streamlining standards; inequities in the region; siting a new transfer station; amending the Comprehensive Plan; and this item will go forward on the July 2, 2019 regular business meeting agenda.
