Presiding Officer Vanessa Kritzer called the meeting to order, reviewed attendance, and overviewed the agenda.

Monthly Financial Report and Quarterly Overtime Report

Ms. Malisa Files, Finance Director, reported to the Members of the Committee regarding: revenue projections are over budget, and has gone down; under expenditures; one-time sales tax on construction is increasing; on-going sales tax is declining; and the overtime report.

40th Street Underpass Operations and Maintenance Agreement

General discussion ensued regarding the bike trail; annual maintenance cost; discussion and agreement; and this item is approved to go forward for Council action on the Consent Agenda.

Revisions to RMC 15.04 Flood Insurance

Mr. Peter Holte, Senior Planner, reported to the Members of the Committee regarding:

- the code needs to be updated to continue in the FEMA Flood Insurance program;
- frequently flooded areas;
- the federal insurance rate maps were recently updated;
- special flood hazard areas;
- takes effect on August 19, 2020;
- the City code must be in compliance with the Washington State model code ordinance;
- current City code includes older language;
- the code changes must be adopted by August 19, 2020;
- clarifications to existing requirements;
- allows the ability to buy flood insurance;
- eligible for long-term flood damage coverage;
- changes require a SEPA review; and
- this will go to the Council for action on August 18, 2020 with an emergency clause to allow for adoption immediately upon action and requires a super majority for passage.

General discussion ensued regarding process improvement; changes in state code; and this item is approved to go forward for Council action on the Consent Agenda.
