Presiding Officer Varisha Khan called the meeting to order and reviewed attendance.

<u>Approval of the Police Department Wellness & Resiliency Coordinator Contract with inLife</u> <u>Clinic LLC, in an Amount Not-to-Exceed \$75,000</u>

Darrell Lowe, Police Chief, reported to the Members of the Committee: this is a renewal of an existing contract and reflects a change in market prices.

General discussion ensued regarding working with all of the first responders; training required; renewal provision; benefit; continuing existing program; best practices; and this is requested to go forward for Council action on May 4, 2021.

<u>Approval of a Contract for Installation of Security Fencing at Fire Station 11 in the Amount of \$74,000</u>

Tom Langton, Acting Deputy Fire Chief, reported to the Members of the Committee: not anticipated during construction of the Fire Station; houses a training and drill site; and security breaches.

General discussion ensued regarding cost of the fencing; mitigation; area to be fenced; impact on response time; proactively addressing issues; demographics; and this is requested to go forward for Council action on May 4, 2021.

Incident Debrief for Sixty-01 Structure Fire

Todd Short and Tom Langton, Acting Deputy Fire Chiefs, reported to the Members of the Committee:

- 911 call;
- No fire safety system installed;
- 28 fire apparatus and five different fire departments;
- No injuries;
- Several units were damaged and occupants were displaced;
- Most multi-family buildings in the City do not have sprinklers;
- Fire damaged structures are re-building without fire sprinklers;
- Code changes; and
- Unattended cooking is the number one cause of fires.

General discussion ensued regarding proposed code changes; displacement; comprehensive review; providing assistance; training for 911 call response; and affordability.

Homeless Outreach Program Quarterly Update

Carol Helland, Director of Planning and Community Development, and Tisza Rutherford, Homeless Outreach Administrator, reported to the Members of the Committee:

- Outreach services;
- Cold weather response;
- Encampment app;
- Community Court;
- Connecting individuals to resources;
- Community service hours;
- Referrals for vaccinations; and
- Program challenges.

General discussion ensued regarding people exiting the criminal justice system; vaccine access; and housing needs.
