1. 2021-23 Stormwater Capacity Grant Acceptance

Department: Public Works Action: Consent, March 15th

Phil Williams, Public Works Director, reported to the Members of the Committee:

- Software.

2. NE 60th Street Full Closure

Department: Public Works Action: Consent, March 15th

Patty Criddle, Senior Engineer, reported to the Members of the Committee regarding:
