OVERVIEW STATEMENT:

Hopelink provides a network of critical social services through a number of different programs - including housing, transportation, family development, financial assistance, employment programs, adult education, financial literacy training and five food banks. The agency's service centers are located in Kirkland, Redmond, Bellevue, Shoreline and Carnation.
