Through extensive stakeholder involvement to gather input on the 2017 Future of Redmond's Community Centers, aquatics facilities were ranked as the highest priority by the community and stakeholder group. WAVE Aquatics pledged to donate one-hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) as their commitment to helping ensure Redmond has a local pool with updated amenities.
